Under Section 1094.6, any lawsuit or legal challenge to any quasi-adjudicative decision made by the City must be filed no later than the 90th day following the date on which such decision becomes final. Any lawsuit or legal challenge, which is not filed within that 90-day period, will be barred. If a person wishes to challenge the nature of the above section in court, they may be limited to raising only those issues they or someone else raised at the meeting described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the City of Santa Clara, at or prior to the meeting. In addition, judicial challenge may be limited or barred where the interested party has not sought and exhausted all available administrative remedies.

AB23 ANNOUNCEMENT: Members of the Santa Clara Stadium Authority, Sports and Open Space Authority and Housing Authority are entitled to receive \$30 for each attended meeting.

**ADVANTAGES AND DISADVANTAGES OF ISSUE**


An advantage is that the appointment will complete a full City Council. There are no disadvantages.

I, Anthony Becker was born in Santa Clara in 1985, attended Pomeroy Elementary, and then moved away to the central valley only to return after my graduation from high school in search of opportunity, the return to my real home and place of my birth. There are numerous reasons why I am applying to the open council seat, they are not limited to just a few but many. I will give the top five reasons why I should be a member of the city council.

1. I have grown up knowing Santa Clara, my roots are here, my heritage and my culture. As a citizen of the great city of Santa Clara, I have become concerned with the direction the city has been taking. This comes in the form of the mass exodus of Santa Clara's most being unable to afford to live here no longer. My family has felt the effects of this, many having to sell property to afford to retire. Santa Clara does not have a full-time City Council. Our elected leaders together set policy and guide, nudge, lead so City staff members dynamically serve our changing community.

Past administrations have embraced bold development goals. Now it is time to implement additional visions that represent the challenges of today's Santa Clara. In 20 years we will be an even more populated community. How will we balance growth over coming years while addressing the realities of the working poor?

However, from the last bell of the day until the first bell of the next day, our community of Santa Clara needs to step up and expand homework support and academic scaffolding. Our City leaders must look without fear at the academic achievement and opportunity gaps for thousands of our community's kids. Students of our local schools need the same passion from staff and Council for after-school support that our community invested to stadium and other construction issues.

City staff members need to know that their City Council members respect them and understand how the changing local economy affects staff families. While bargaining is a structured process, our City Councilmembers must continue to convey to municipal agency staff that Santa Clara is a working class community that respects the people who serve our residents and businesses.

I have more than 20 years of civic leadership experience in elected and appointed roles. I will honor the opportunity to become one of your teammates, bringing an additional perspective to the deliberative process that must serve our residents well. With my comprehensive municipal service background, I will transition quickly to effective City Council membership as a respectful collaborator to help guide us towards the dynamic Mission City future ahead.

When the building was complete but not opened because of political wrangling, Kathy went to city, county and even state leaders in Sacramento to make her case. She believed that opening the library was of the utmost importance to the neighborhood residents, especially families who had waited years for a library branch. She gathered support, held meetings at her home, wrote letters to civic leaders and local newspapers, partnered with the Library Foundation, organized peaceful demonstrations in front of the library and spent hundreds of hours to get the library opened. And it worked!!!

Kathy believes in the city of Santa Clara and its schools and has worked on bond campaigns, school board elections, stadium campaign, city council campaigns, and fundraising events which gives her a broad background to bring to the council. She is active in the Sister Cities Program, Mission City Community Fund, Santa Clara Library Foundation and Friends, Don Callejon parent group – just to name a few. For each of these groups she gives her time, talents and dedication.

Residents of Santa Clara want someone to represent them who is an active citizen and you can't find anyone more involved than Kathy. But I think, for myself, the most important trait Kathy will bring to the City Council is her integrity. She is one of the most honest leaders I have ever worked with and if she doesn't agree with you, she will stick to her principles no matter what. That does not mean she will not compromise, because she has had a lot of experience with that, but if she believes something is important she will work as hard as she can to make it happen. I don't see her as a politician in the sense that she makes empty promises or changes her beliefs to get ahead. She is a politician in that she knows how to use the system to make positive change and move things forward.

Congratulations upon the selection of our new mayor, Lisa Gillmor, and the prompt, decisive, unified manner in which you made that selection. Ms. Gillmor will be a very dedicated, intelligent, and articulate mayor.

With respect to filling the City Council seat, which Ms. Gillmor has vacated, I would recommend that you seriously consider appointing Karen Hardy for the remaining months of the current term to that seat for each of the following reasons:

I was awestruck and immediately hoped that some day she would serve on the City Council. She is employed as a City Planner (don't know for what City).

My other suggestion to fill the vacant seat would be Pat Mahan. Both Mahan or Cherukuru are candidates that could "hit the ground running" so to speak. The learning curve would be minimal.
